The Money Edition: Will Cinderella's Carriage turn into a Pumpkin?

Money and politics; two of my least favourite topics, but they need to be addressed. First the good news. With the help of our funding consultants Nine Lions, we were successful in getting a Community Initiatives Grant from Alberta Culture to the tune of \$50,000! Big thanks to Minister Heather Klimchuk for the approval and to Calgary Cross MLA Yvonne Fritz who met with us on November 1 to express her congratulations and to do the official cheque handover.

Now for some cold water: We need to put another \$400,000 in the bank by August 1, 2014, or by the terms of our contract with the City, the deal is off and they can reclaim both airplanes. Anything that we may have planned to earn after that date, such as future casinos and raffles does not count. Its all or nothing.

Does that sound like a lot? It's a matter of perspective and scale. It's more than I have, but did you catch this headline last week? **"\$25 Million Donation to newly named Werklund**

School of Education at the University of Calgary." There is likely no better place on earth right now to look for what we need than right here in Calgary and in Alberta. We need to identify those with an interest in our cause and the means to cover what we need. Know someone that wants this kind of headline?

What are we doing to meet this need? We have further engaged our funding consultants Nine Lions to develop a list of potential financial supporters from local foundations, corporations and individuals within and outside of our membership. They tell us that the kind of money we need will most likely come from those whom we already know. Now is the time.

We are very fortunate in having a new member who has also stepped up to be a very active part of our funding team. Newly retired business reporter Dave Simms jumped in to do some direct appeal and application work and has already turned up



a nice \$7,500 contribution from the Calgary Airport Authority.

Dave further discovered that any contributions made to a registered charity, such as us, through the Alberta Treasury Branch gets 15% added to the donation. So the CAA donation becomes \$8,625, which is then matched by the City to be worth \$17,250 to us! Now if **you** make a donation you also get a tax receipt from us which would see you getting about half of your donation back as a tax refund. In other words, if you donate a \$1 through the ATB, it actually costs you .50 cents and is worth \$2.30 to us. Great numbers, thanks Dave.

Board member Trevor McTavish completed two grant

applications under Alberta Historical Resources. These have the potential to be worth as much as \$25,000 per airplane. We will find out in January if our applications were successful.

Our recent WestJet raffle netted us almost \$10,000 and we will be eligible for another next spring.

We are also working on a 'sponsor a piece of airplane' program to be released on December 1. Stay tuned.

Six years ago this month we first heard rumours of the possible sale of the Mosquito to England. Since then we have cleared every hurdle, won every fight, accomplished every goal and earned the support of City Hall, the Mayor, the pro-

vincial government, museum professionals in Canada and around the world and most importantly you. I don't know where the money will come from. I know that it must, and on time in order for us to live up to our mandate. We have one more hurdle to clear. Thank you.

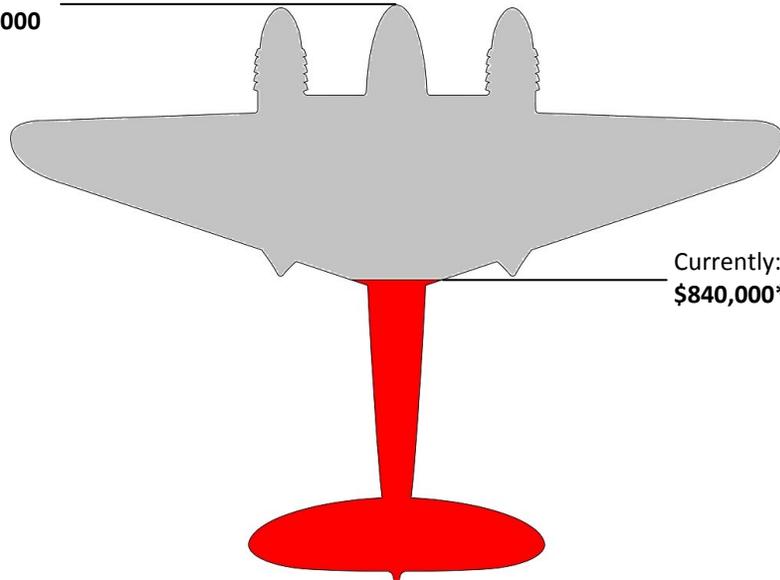
