Board member David Simms has been focusing on video production and fundraising since he joined our ranks last year. We found out on June 20 that his application to the Calgary Foundation for \$60,000 to fund the educational and display components of our project was approved, putting our fund raising efforts over the top and in fact exceeding our goal of needing to raise \$800,000, by over \$40,000 and a full six weeks before the deadline of August 1.

Also key to our funding success this year was our direct appeal to members, new and old. And you came through in spades. A big thanks to our renewing members, 77% of whom added a donation averaging \$105 per person to their renewal this year. Take a bow, pat yourself on the back and plan to attend our celebratory party on August 9th. Details to follow. Individual

thank you notes are on the way to all of you who contributed online through the ATB Cares program (They are slow to supply that info to us).

With the City's guaranteed match of whatever we raise, we now have more than the full \$1,600,000 needed to restore both airplanes.

The City of Calgary visits Nanton

Saturday May 24 saw the first onsite inspection by City of Calgary representative Kevin Forster of our progress on the Mosquito. Kevin was escorted by two advisors with experience in vintage aircraft restoration. The group was ably toured by Jack McWilliam who proudly detailed our work to date and the challenges we yet face on the project. Our considerable thanks goes to the many CMS members who helped clean up and prepare for the visit. The tour was held

in conjunction with the Bomber Command Museum's special events to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the VC winning flight by Ian Bazalgette. Our inspectors were treated to sight of hundreds of museum visitors as well as a four-engine Lanc run before heading back to Calgary.

As much as we provide a mountain of information in the way of quarterly reports to the City, Kevin admitted that

getting a firsthand look at our work gave him a whole new appreciation of our significant accomplishments and that he wanted to come back to show our work to other City staff and managers. The face to face meeting was also a good opportunity to start the direct conversation about the timeline to complete the Mosquito as City direction to have it finished in five years was never realistic. •

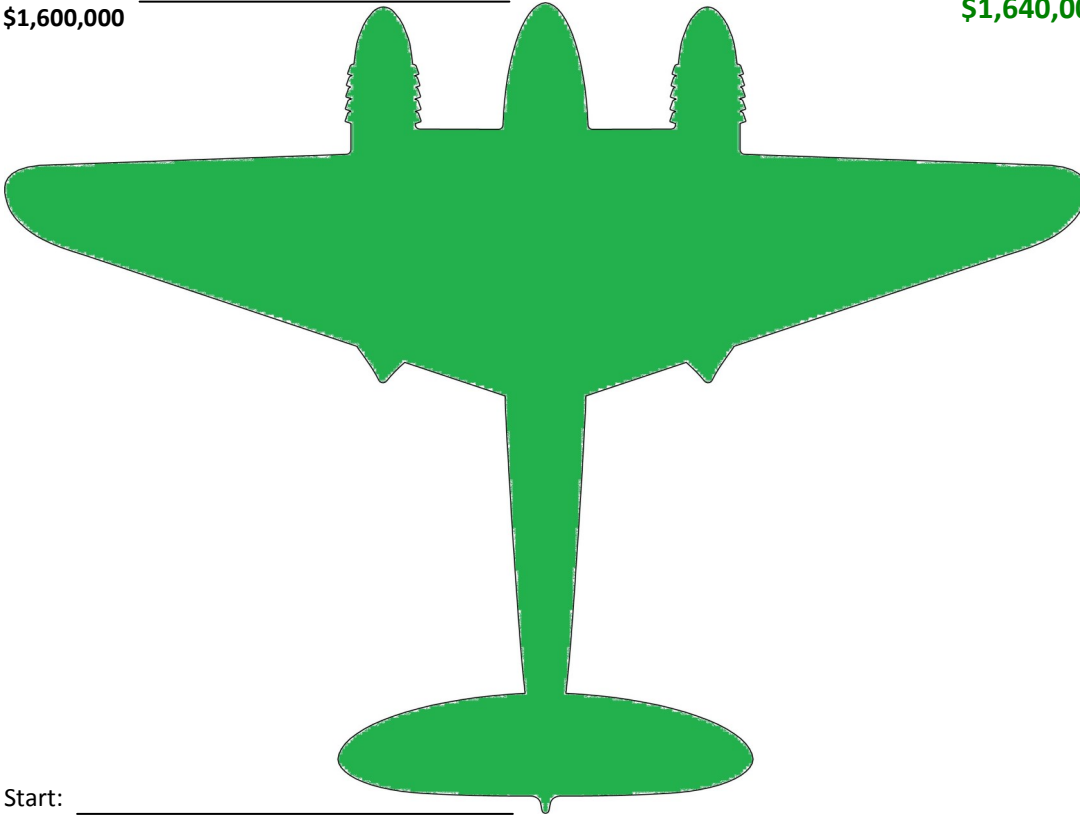
